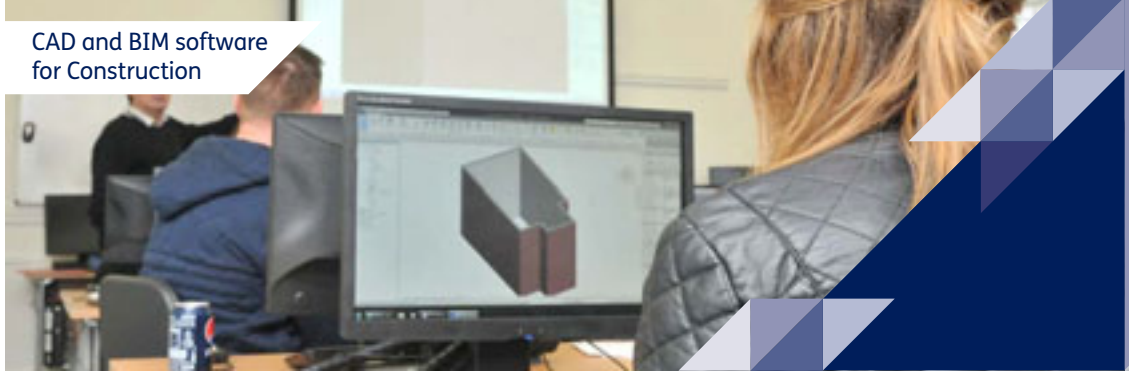

Fees and finance



Our tuition fees are £5,995* per year for full-time courses. Part-time course fees are calculated on a course-by-course basis.

How does the fee system work?

Eligible students can apply for a tuition fee loan from Student Finance England at the same time as applying for other maintenance support. There are no up-front fees to pay and you will only start repaying your student loan once you have left university and are earning over £21,000** a year.

How do I pay my loan back?

If you start studying in September 2017 or later, the earliest you'll start repaying is the April after you leave your course if your annual income is over £21,000**. Repayments are deducted automatically by your employer in the same way they deduct tax and national insurance payments. If you stop working or if your salary drops below £21,000 per year then your student loan repayments would stop automatically.

The table below will give you an idea of how much you might repay each month:

Help with living costs

Financial support with living costs is available for full-time, eligible students. If eligible, the amount you receive will depend on your household income. This means the total annual income before tax of anyone you live with, such as your parents or partner.

Maintenance Loan

Students can receive up to £8,200* per year as a Maintenance Loan if they are living away from home. The Maintenance Loan is repaid alongside the tuition fee loan once you're earning over £21,000* per year.

Help for parents

There are a number of schemes that can help parents to balance the cost of childcare and study, including Childcare Grants and Parents' Learning Allowance. Full-time eligible students with an adult who depends on them financially

Full-time applicants

To apply for a full-time undergraduate degree or Higher National Certificate or Diploma you need to submit your application via the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS).

Applications for 2017 entry should reach UCAS by **15 January 2017**. Don't worry if you miss the deadline, you can still apply to study at UCB via UCAS up until the summer. However, please be aware that offers are dependent on the availability of places so we would advise you to apply early.


If your current school or college is registered with UCAS just ask your tutor or careers advisor for help. If you're not currently in education but are based in the UK you can apply online through UCAS independently.

The UCAS website provides full instructions on the application process.

Find the right course for you



Deciding which course to choose can be daunting but we have a wide range so there is sure to be something to suit you.

We offer **undergraduate degrees**, these are Bachelor of Arts with Honours (BA Hons) or Bachelor of Science with Honours (BSc Hons). Which one you graduate with depends on the course you choose. The course title will indicate which degree it is.

We also offer **foundation degrees, Higher National Certificates (HNCs) and Higher National Diplomas (HNDs)**. These are qualifications in their own right but are also equivalent to the first year of a degree (HNCs) or the first two years of a degree (foundation degrees/HNDs). You can

usually do a final year top-up after successfully completing a foundation degree or an HND to be awarded with a degree.

Our **Teacher Training courses** are offered both at undergraduate and postgraduate level. To complete a Professional Graduate Certificate in Education, a Postgraduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) or a Postgraduate Diploma in Education (Advanced PGCE) you will need to have a first degree or equivalent and relevant work experience.

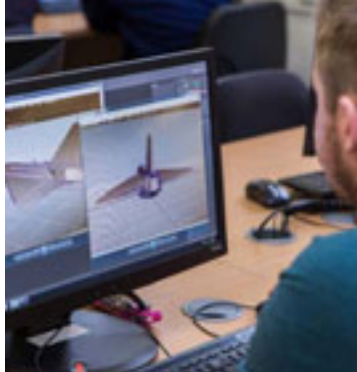

Whether you want a career in the Art and Design industry or to nurture your creative potential, this course offers you an opportunity to explore a range of creative practices including painting, sculpture, ceramics, textiles, printmaking and photography.

The programme encourages personal exploration in the broader context of art and design practice and contextual studies underpinned by drawing.

The course is delivered through a series of assignments encouraging a holistic approach to problem solving and a broader professional identity.

Students will visit a range of local and national exhibitions and be able to participate in the annual residential.

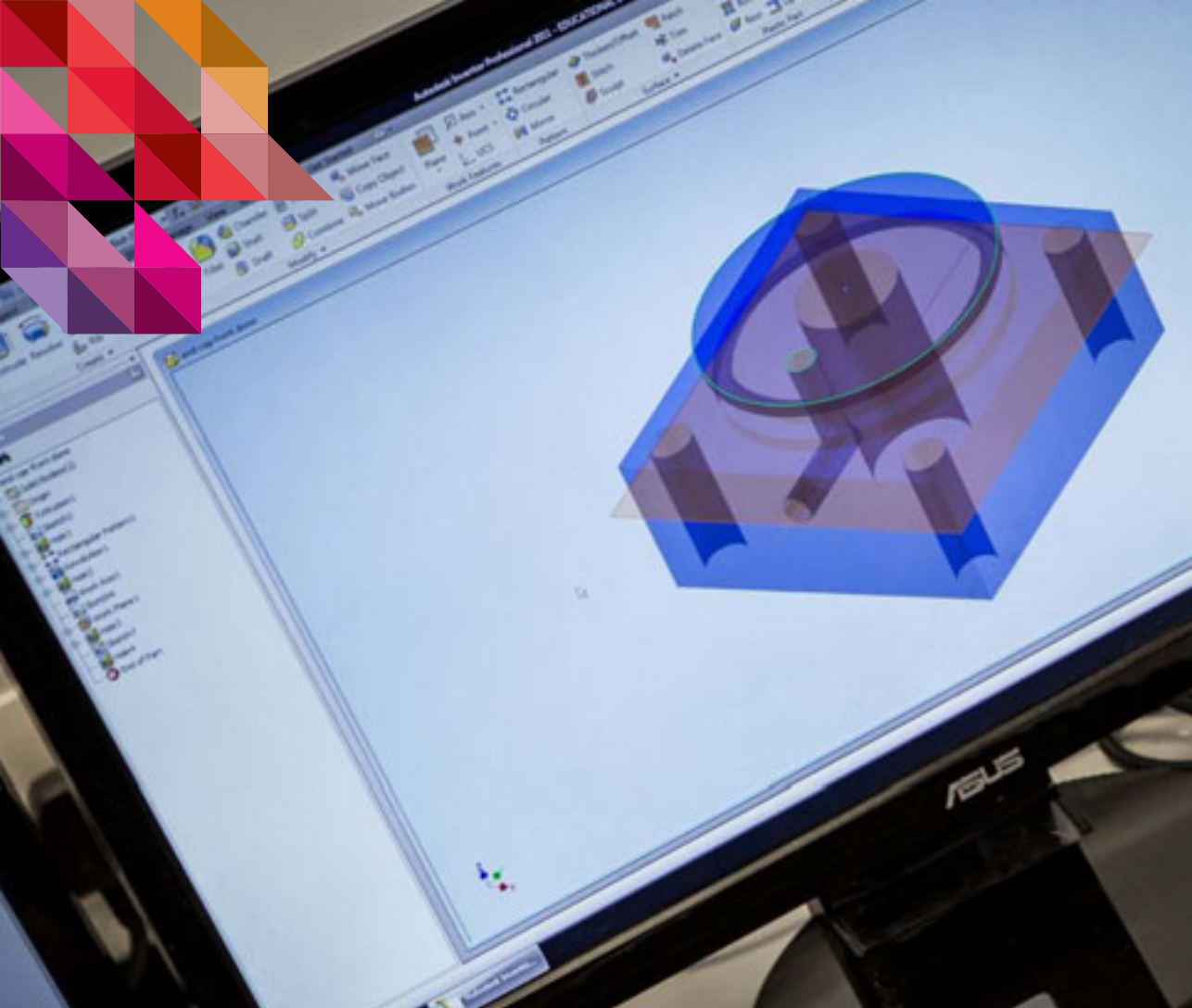

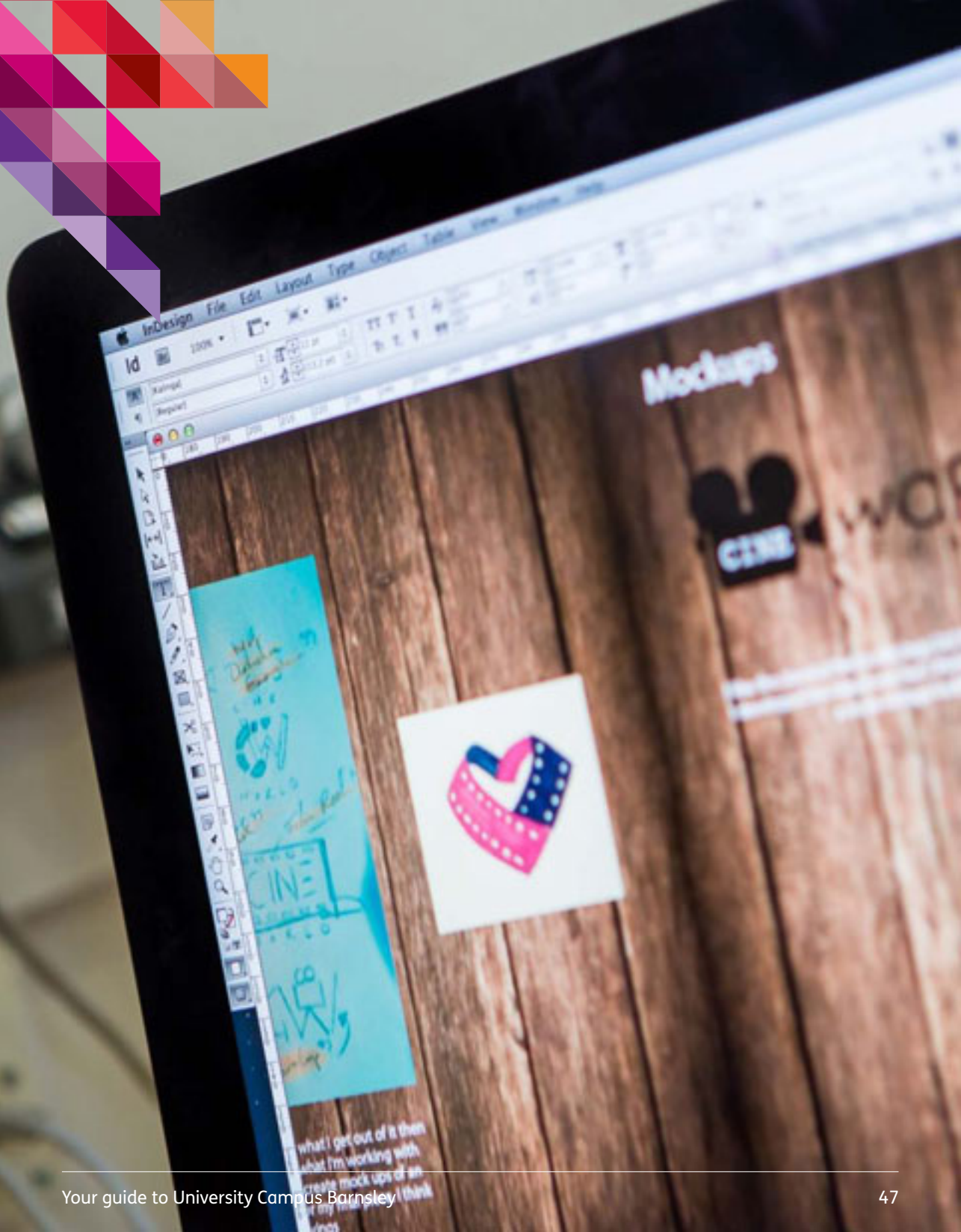

Learning Support Foundation Degree*

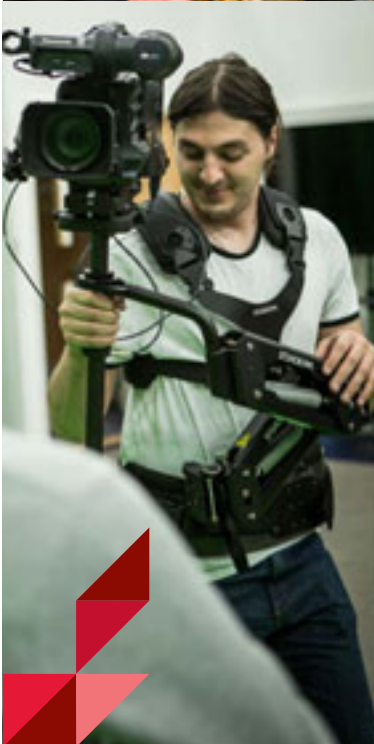

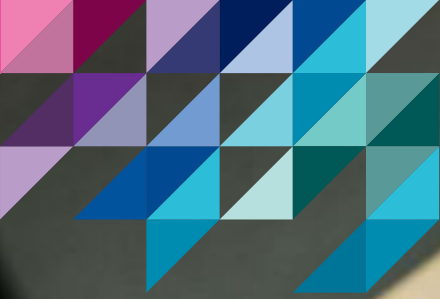

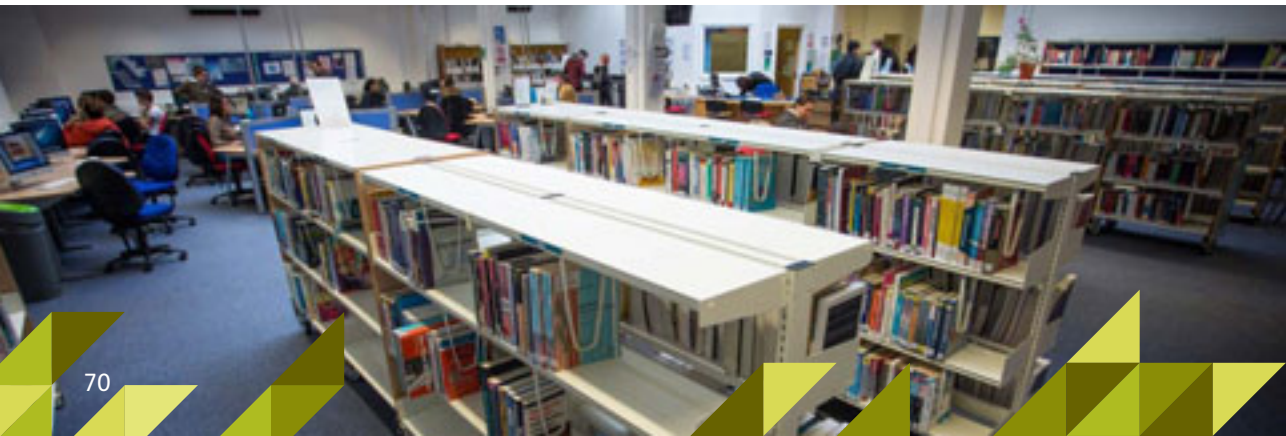

Once you return that to us, together with your evidence of disability, you will be offered an appointment with the Disability Adviser to explore what you might need for the course and, in most cases, to begin the process of completing your DSA funding application.

This is a confidential, informal meeting which gives you the chance to tell us how you feel your disability, health issue or specific learning difficulty might impact upon your studies. The sooner we make contact with you the better so that, where possible, your support strategies can be agreed before you start your course.

University Campus Barnsley has a diverse international community and welcomes the cultural and social difference our international students bring to campus life.

The International Student Advice Team

The team exists to enable you to make the most of your time here at Barnsley. We are happy to answer any questions you may have concerning our courses and entry requirements.


Before you leave your country, we will communicate with you regularly and provide you with essential information to help you with your application, support your visa application, and help to make your journey to us a safe and smooth one.

We run a transport service from both Manchester Airport and Heathrow Airport at the start of each academic year. This service is paid for by students separately to any other costs. The cost for this service is a maximum of £70 from Manchester Airport and a maximum of £225 from Heathrow Airport**. We organise a welcome programme of events that includes information sessions, social events and tours of the campus, town and region.

Our mentoring scheme matches current UK and new international students and is a helpful and friendly way to integrate yourself into University Campus Barnsley life.

We encourage all students to get involved with activities outside of the academic environment, whether that be joining a sports team, cultural society or participating in community life as a volunteer. Getting involved gives you the chance to meet new friends, develop new skills, improve your English, learn about different cultures and, ultimately, enhance your employability within a global career market.

Tuition fees and living expenses

International student fees for HNC/Ds are £10,500 per annum* and undergraduate degree courses are £12,000 per annum*. We also offer scholarships for students based on their academic grades and IELTS score. 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Living in Barnsley

Barnsley is a great place to shop and has one of the most famous markets in the UK, with fresh produce and a wide range of other products available at very competitive prices. Work has begun on the new town centre market development due for completion in 2016/17.

You are required by UK Visa and Immigration (UKVI) to have a minimum of £11,165* in your personal bank account on entry into the UK to cover yearly personal and accommodation expenses, excluding fees, international flights and the summer vacation. Any person with an account balance below this amount is likely to be refused entry into the UK.

International applications

University Campus Barnsley has a Tier 4 Sponsor Status from UK Visa and Immigration (UKVI) and we receive many applications. Although most courses do not have a deadline for application, we recommend that you apply as early as possible, as some courses do fill up and we may close applications early. It is not necessary to wait for

your final certificates, transcripts or references before you apply.

We do ask you to check the entry requirements for your country before you apply. If, however, your country is not listed on our website, please contact the International Team for advice and guidance.

English language

You must have a good level of English proficiency so that you can follow your chosen course.

A minimum IELTS score of 5.5 or equivalent is required for our HNC/D programmes, and a score of IELTS 6.0 (minimum 5.5 in all elements) for our degree programmes*.

We offer a range of English language preparation courses to help you reach the required level of English for your course.

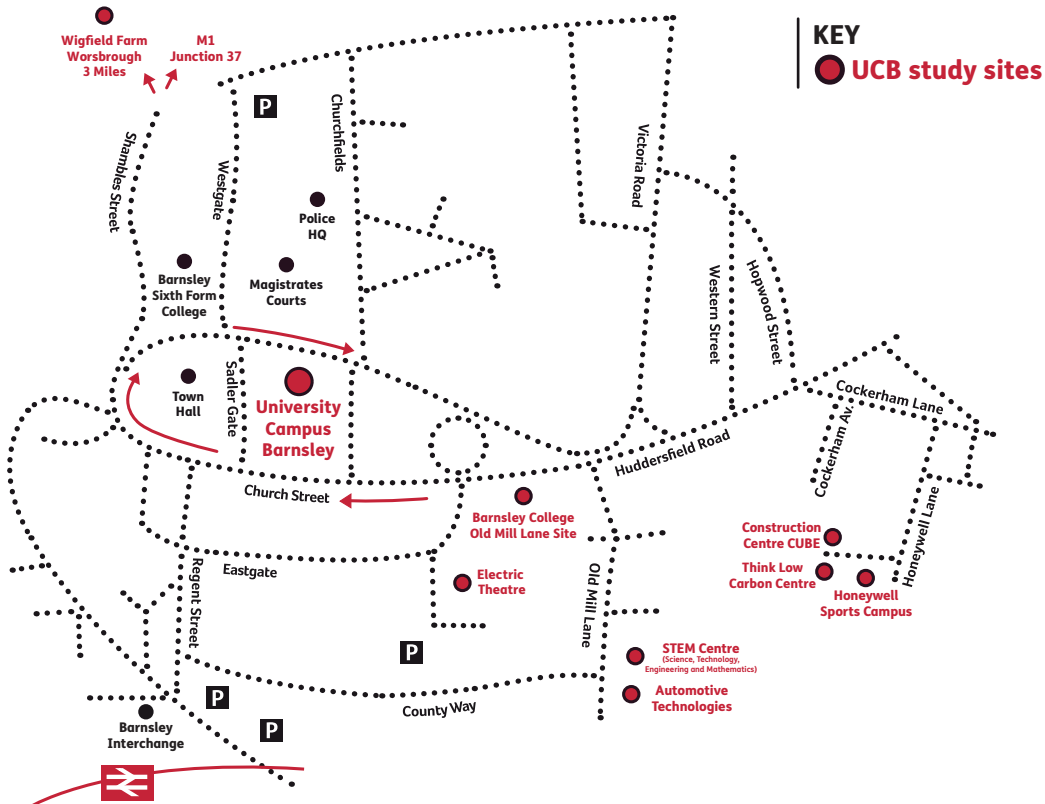
