Start Date / Duration

Various start dates throughout the year. The minimum duration for this apprenticeship is 18 months.

Entry Requirements

You should:

- Hold two GCSEs at grade C/4 or above including English and maths
- Be employed within the catering industry or have an employer in this area willing to take you on as an apprentice

Course Content

Hospitality team members can work across a wide variety of establishments, such as bars, restaurants, cafes, conference centres, banqueting venues, hotels or contract caterers. The role is very varied and although hospitality team members tend to specialise in an area, they have to be adaptable and ready to support team members across the business.

The list below sets out how the credit has been assigned across the mandatory units. All units in this qualification are mandatory.

Specialist supervisory functions can be any of the following:

- Food and beverage service
- Alcoholic beverage service
- Barista
- Food production
- Concierge and guest service
- Housekeeping
- Reception
- Reservations
- Conference and events operations

How will I be assessed?

E-portfolio and workplace observation. Guided learner hours are delivered during contracted working hours.

What Equipment Will I Need?

Your uniform will be provided by your employer. Equipment will be discussed at your induction session.

What can I do next?

On completion of this pathway, you may progress onto further qualifications specific to their work context or into employment.

How much does the course cost?

There is no cost to being an apprentice. All costs associated with your apprenticeship, including the cost of training and your salary, will be paid by your employer.
