T-LEVELS

What are T Levels?

T Levels are courses for 16 to 18 year olds that will be studied at the same level as A Levels. They are for young people who would prefer a more technical education when they come to College, rather than following a purely academic pathway, or a work-based apprenticeship.

T Levels will provide a mixture of:

- Technical knowledge and practical skills specific to your chosen industry or occupation.
- An industry placement of at least 45 days in your chosen industry or occupation.
- Relevant maths, English and digital skills.
- Common workplace skills.

Students who achieve a T Level will get a nationally recognised certificate which employers will use as evidence in their recruitment. T Levels will offer students a mixture of classroom or workshop-based learning and 'on-the-job' experience.

When are they being introduced?

Barnsley College is one of only 54 colleges, and the only college in South Yorkshire, to run T Levels from September 2020.

What can I do with a T Level qualification?

When you have completed a T Level course, you will be able to choose between moving into:

- A skilled occupation.
- Higher or degree level apprenticeships.
- Higher level technical study, including Higher Education.

What subjects will be available?

Courses in construction, digital and education and childcare will be first taught from September 2020. A further 22 courses will be rolled out in stages from 2021, which will cover subjects such as finance and accounting, engineering and manufacturing, and creative and design.



STUDY PROGRAMMES AND GCSE GRADES

Barnsley College has a huge range of study programmes available including vocational, apprenticeships, A Levels and traineeships.

Study programmes

Each study programme has a qualification or a work placement as its core aim.

Every study programme is tailored to each individual depending on previous qualifications, aspirations and abilities. Study programmes can include:

- A qualification.
- English and maths qualifications (if you don't already have a grade 4/C or above in English and maths).
- Level 3 core maths qualification designed for students who have already achieved a grade 4/C in GCSE maths and would like to study maths further.
- A work experience opportunity.
- Enrichment opportunities including educational visits, guest speaker workshops and participating in charity events.

Entry requirements

Everyone is interviewed before being accepted on a programme to ensure it is the right one for you, and that it matches your skills, abilities and future goals.

We have a set of standard entry requirements; however, the entry requirements shown on the course pages are dependent on individual needs, skills, experience and aspirations. Different subjects require different skills and some of these will be assessed at interview. For example, for music or performing arts courses you will usually be required to pass an audition.

Our entry requirements are guidelines so that you know what level you should be aiming at.

ANIMAL CARE (PRACTICAL SKILLS)

Based at our Wigfield Farm campus, this course is ideal if you are interested in a career working with animals and it introduces the main principles and practices of animal care and welfare.

This course gives you a broad introduction to the animal care industry, animal care and welfare from managing a pet shop or grooming dogs to caring for exotic animals.

Course themes:

- Feeding and watering animals
- Preparing animal accommodation
- Maintaining health and wellbeing of animals
- Handling and restraining animals
- Safe and effective working practices in Land Based Studies
- Animals in the wild and in society
- Work experience

Entry requirements:

Two GCSEs at grade 2/E or above including English.

Level 2

Certificate

ANIMAL CARE (PRACTICAL SKILLS)

This one-year study programme aims to develop your practical skills, knowledge and understanding of care and welfare for a variety of animals.

Based at our Wigfield Farm campus, you will have access to the facilities the working farm provides to help prepare you for work in this interesting industry.

Course themes:

- Maintaining animal health and wellbeing
- Delivering basic animal treatments
- Selecting, preparing and maintaining animal accommodation
- Controlling and restraining animals
- Preparing and providing animal feed

Entry requirements:

Four GCSEs at grade 2/3 (E/D) or above including English and maths.

Level 3

Certificate

ANIMAL CARE (PRACTICAL SKILLS)

This one-year study programme, based at our Wigfield Farm campus, is for students progressing from a Level 2 animal-related qualification.

It will further develop the experience, skills and knowledge required to prepare you for further work or study within animal care.

Course themes:

- Animal handling
- Managing the care of young animals
- Establishing animals in a new environment
- Planning, supervising and controlling the movement of animals
- Promoting and maintaining animal wellbeing and health
- Planning animal accommodation

Entry requirements:

Level 2 animal-related qualification and Functional Skills Level 1 in English and maths.

ENGLISH AND MATHS

If you do not already have a grade 4/C or above in GCSE English and maths, you will automatically undertake further study in these subjects as part of your study programme.

Technical Diploma

ANIMAL CARE

This one-year study programme based at Wigfield Farm is ideal if you are interested in a career working with animals. It introduces the main principles and practices of animal care and welfare.

You will gain experience and confidence handling a wide range of animals including meerkats, cows, goats, horses, pigs, sheep, rabbits and alpacas!

Course themes:

- Feeding and watering animals
- Preparing animal accommodation
- Animal health and wellbeing
- Handling and restraining animals
- Safe and effective working practices
- Animals in the wild and in society

Entry requirements:

Two GCSEs at grade 2/E or above including English.

Level 2

Technical Certificate

ANIMAL CARE

Based at our Wigfield Farm campus, you will gain work-related experience studying a mix of practical and theory subjects.

The wide range of topics covered on this course open up diverse career opportunities within the animal care industry for you to pursue.

Course themes:

- Maintaining animal health and welfare
- Animal feeding and accommodation
- Undertaking practical animal feeding
- Care of exotic animals
- Principles and practice of animal behaviour and handling
- Basic principles of animal biology

You will be required to undertake 150 hours of work placement.

Entry requirements:

Four GCSEs at grade 3/D or above including English and maths.

Level 3

Advanced Technical Diploma

ANIMAL MANAGEMENT

This two-year study programme gives you the opportunity to develop a range of specialist, technical and practical skills and further your knowledge at our Wigfield Farm campus.

You will learn how to work safely around animals and be responsible for planning and carrying out animal health and husbandry, feeding and nutrition.

Course themes:

- Animal behaviour and communication
- Wildlife and ecology conservation
- Farm livestock husbandry and welfare
- Exotic animal health and husbandry
- Business management in the land based sector
- Undertake estate skills
- Animal feeding and nutrition
- Biological systems of animals
- Animal welfare and breeding
- Wildlife management and rehabilitation
- Animal nursing
- Zoological collections

Entry requirements:

Five GCSEs at grade 4/C or above including English, maths and Science.

(An alternative study programme option is still available at Level 3 if you do not achieve a Grade 4/C in maths and science).

VETERINARY NURSE*

EARNING POTENTIAL: £15K - £30K

A Veterinary Nurse provides assistance to vets in the treatment and care of sick or injured animals, assists the Veterinary Surgeon during surgical and medical treatments of animals, prepares the operating theatre, sterilises equipment and assists in theatre as required.



CONSERVATION OR ENVIRONMENTAL PROFESSIONAL*

EARNING POTENTIAL: £21K - £37K

Conservation and Environmental Professionals are responsible for the day-to-day running and management of areas of the countryside and the wider environment. They carry out practical conservation activities and assist in promoting awareness of the natural environment. 

Level 3

Extended Certificate/Foundation Diploma/Diploma/Extended Diploma

APPLIED SCIENCE

These programmes are designed to provide either introductions to science or pathways onto Higher Education to study a science-based degree, such as Biomedical Science, Pharmaceutical Science, Chemistry, Biology, Healthcare Science, Paramedic Science or Forensic Science, or a career in the science industry.

You will undertake study of topics such as medical physics, inorganic and organic chemistry, genetics and biochemistry. Your time will be spent in the science laboratories where you will perfect scientific techniques and become trained in performing a vast array of scientific practical skills required by universities.

Course themes for Extended Certificate:

- Introduction to the three sciences: Biology, Chemistry and Physics
- Developing a varied skill set of scientific practical techniques
- Understanding health and safety, risks and regulations associated with working in the science industry
- Developing scientific writing skills

Course themes for Foundation Diploma, Diploma or Extended Diploma:

- In depth theoretical knowledge of Biology, Chemistry and Physics
- Development of a vast array of scientific practical techniques within numerous scientific fields
- Understanding of legislation relating to working in the science industry
- Development of basic laboratory technician skills
- Preparation for a career in the science industries
- In depth knowledge of complex concepts such as Biochemistry, Medical Physics and Chemistry
- Ability to use mathematical and statistical formulae and calculations
- Advanced academic, scientific writing skills

Assessment includes examinations and internally and externally assessed assignments.

Entry requirements

For the Extended Certificate or Foundation Diploma: Four GCSEs at grade 4/C or above **OR** a Level 2 in Applied Science. GCSE English and maths will be accepted at grade 3/D under the condition that they must be studied alongside the course. Equivalent qualifications will be considered on an independent basis.

All applicants must have a positive reference.

For the Diploma: Five GCSEs at grade 4/C or above including English, maths and, preferably, science (Functional skills English and maths may be accepted once you have been individually assessed) **OR** a Level 2 in Applied Science **OR** a Level 3 Foundation Diploma in Applied Science.

For the Extended Diploma: Five GCSEs at grade 4/C or above including English, maths and, preferably, science (Functional skills English and maths may be accepted once you have been individually assessed) **OR** a Level 3 Diploma in Applied Science.

A positive reference and excellent attendance record is required.

Studying Applied Science at Barnsley College will enable you to develop skills for a range of careers such as:

CHEMIST*

EARNING POTENTIAL: £18K - £50K

After completion of a degree, you can progress into chemistry. Chemists study all sorts of different materials and chemicals and discover how they behave under different conditions. They could be involved in sorts of work, including healthcare, pharmaceuticals and biotechnology, the food industry, new product development, agriculture, environmental and forensics.

CLINICAL SCIENTIST*

EARNING POTENTIAL: £30K - £50K

Clinical scientists are healthcare experts. They work with patients or support clinical staff. The job can involve a wide range of work tasks which can include clinical or laboratory work, testing, applied research, management and teaching. Clinical scientists research and develop techniques and equipment to help prevent, diagnose and treat illness.

MARINE BIOLOGIST**

EARNING POTENTIAL: £30K - £65K

After completion of a degree, you could progress into marine biology. A marine biologist studies plant and animal life in the ocean and on the shoreline. They are interested in the way these organisms develop and how they interact with the environment and each other.

The range of sea life is truly vast so a marine biologist's work is incredibly varied. They could study areas such as the impact of pollution, nuclear power stations, coral reefs, oil refineries, industrial activity and tourism on the oceans.

The course will encourage you to re-engage with education, understand the required knowledge and gain skills you will need to progress to further education or employment within the creative industries.

You will be encouraged to explore and develop art and design ideas in both 2D and 3D. The work you produce will be shaped by your own research.

Course themes:

You will work with a range of media and techniques within the following areas:

- Painting, drawing and printmaking

Entry requirements:

Four GCSEs at grade 2/E or above including English and a positive school report. Where applicants do not quite meet the entry requirements, the tutor may use their discretion based on the portfolio and interview.

Diploma

ART AND DESIGN

This study programme provides an opportunity for those with an interest in visual arts to explore, develop and test their creativity within a stimulating and demanding qualification structure which supports transition to university level study or a career in the creative industries.

Throughout the course you will explore all areas of art and design, developing skills through practical work and theoretical study. Your work will be enhanced through educational and gallery visits; previous students have visited Yorkshire Sculpture Park and the Tate Modern London.

Course themes:

After developing the foundation skills within year 1, in year 2 you will be given a brief for each unit and will complete these within your chosen discipline including:

- Fine art
- Fashion textiles
- 3D design

Five GCSEs at grade 4/C or above including English and a portfolio of work.

GRAPHIC DESIGN

Graphic Designers are visual communicators; creating and combining words, symbols, and images to professionally express ideas and messages.

On this study programme you will study all areas of graphic design, photography and digital media including web design.

You will also get the chance to develop your work through educational and gallery visits including international residential trips to cities such as New York and Paris.

Course themes:

- Designing for the creative industry
- Design for print
- Design for advertising
- Digital photography and image manipulation
- Typography
- Social media applications

Entry requirements:

Five GCSEs at grade 4/C or above including English and a portfolio of work.

ENGLISH AND MATHS

If you do not already have a grade 4/C or above in GCSE English and maths, you will automatically undertake further study in these subjects as part of your study programme.

Level 3

Diploma/Extended Diploma

FASHION AND CLOTHING

The Fashion and Clothing Extended Diploma is a practical, work related course.

Throughout the course you will investigate and develop both your creativity and theoretical knowledge of fashion and clothing.

You will produce a portfolio of design work including a sample folder of techniques, pattern cutting work, practical fashion and clothing projects and a small catwalk collection which you will showcase in our end of year exhibition. You will also get the chance to go on educational and gallery visits.

Course themes:

- Drawing development and design method
- Historical and contextual studies
- Pattern cutting and development
- Fashion marketing
- Computers in art and design
- Design realisation

Entry requirements:

Five GCSEs at grade 4/C or above including English. GCSE in Art or Textiles will be an advantage.

Level 3/4

Foundation Diploma

ART AND DESIGN

This qualification aims to facilitate your progression, primarily, but not exclusively, to appropriate Higher Education in Art, Design and Media. We build on your prior experience, linking skills already acquired with ideas and challenges which will extend your critical independence.

This course explores a wide range of art and design activities including media experimentation and research.

Course themes:

You will specialise in one of the following areas:

- Fine art
- Graphic design
- 3D design
- Fashion/textiles

Entry requirements:

One A Level or Level 3 Diploma qualification. (Individual consideration will be given if you are 21 years of age or over with no formal qualifications). You must be aged 18 or above and have a good portfolio of work.

GRAPHIC DESIGNER*

Designer, Advertising, Graphic Artist

EARNING POTENTIAL: £15K - £40K

Graphic Designers work on a variety of products and activities, such as websites, advertising, magazines, games, packaging and branding and work with a wide range of media including photography and Computer Aided Design (CAD) to fulfil briefs set out by their clients. They have to think creatively to produce new and innovative ideas which meet their clients' needs.

FASHION DESIGNER*

EARNING POTENTIAL: £20K - £60K

Being a Fashion Designer is all about working on the design of clothing. There are three main markets that a fashion designer can work for: haute couture, ready-to-wear and high street fashion. A Fashion Designer may work to their own brief or be given a brief to work towards, but this all depends on the level of responsibility they have and what company they work for.
