

Ebooks for Successful Study

Ebooks are online equivalents of print books. Unlike print books they are accessible 24/7 over the Internet. They are also easy to search for specific topics. Although most books are still print, Barnsley College libraries also buys some course relevant ebooks to help you with your studies.

How can I access Barnsley College ebooks?

You can access ebooks in 2 ways:

1. Search **Discovery** (or HERITAGE our Library catalogue). Along with print books, you can find and access ebooks.

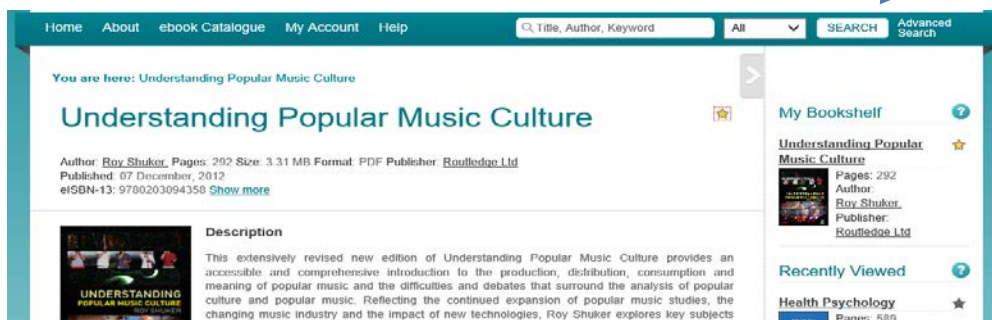
To refine your search in **Discovery** to just ebooks, on the lefthand side you can *Limit by Sourcetype* to *eBooks*.

2. OpenAthens. Log in to MyAthens, select an ebook database and search that collection of ebooks. When you are in an ebook database you can search the full contents of ebooks for detailed information.

What are your ebook collections?

Dawson Books

This is our main source for HE ebooks. Click on **ebook Catalogue** to browse the titles we own. Or use the **Advanced Search** and *Search By: Full Text* drop down to look for specific topics within books.



Read online

With this option you can read the book, and add your own notes etc. You can also print and save permanently (up to copyright limits).

Download ebook

Use this option if you have limited online access. You 'borrow' the ebook for up to 7 days but can't print or save from it. When the time is up, it's gone and you need to download it again. To download a title you need to have Adobe Reader installed on your device. If you are using an ipad or iphone there is a separate link at the base of the dialogue box.

Ebook Central

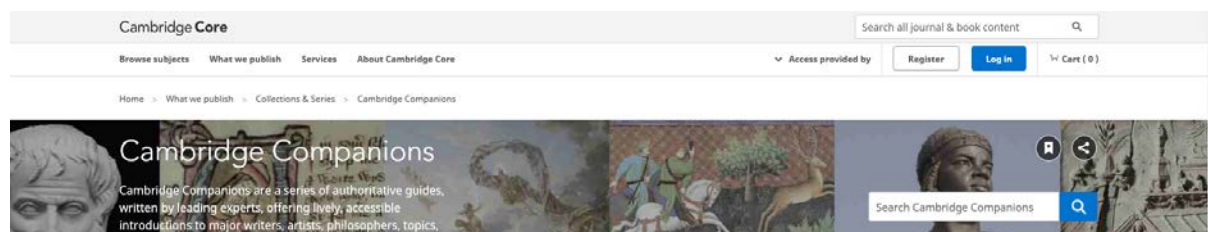


Proquest Ebook Central has around 400 titles and is very easy to use. You can browse the ebooks by subject areas or search across the whole collection.

Books can be 'borrowed' for up to 21 days. To download, your device needs Adobe Digital Editions installed. Or you can read online. Again when reading online, you can add notes, print or copy permanently (up to copyright limits).

Cambridge Companions

Over 500 books from the academic publisher Cambridge University Press available to search via Cambridge Core. Collections include literature, philosophy, culture and music. Chapters are pdf files and can be printed or saved.
