something new, meet people, learn new skills and give back to their community. The Gold College status was awarded following the graduation from the programme of 160 students from our Sport, Public Services and Travel and Tourism departments.


he was awarded an Unsung Hero Award together with the Principal's Award at our Staff Star Awards.








