	The meeting was quorate.	



B23/052	Agenda I tem No. 2: Apologies for absence Apologies were received from Donovan Hutchinson and Mark Fogarty.
B23/053	Agenda Item No. 3: Declarations of interest Kay Dickinson declared her interest as a Director of ITS, Smartstyle, BCDC and Think. Yiannis Koursis declared his interest as a Director of ITS, Smartstyle, BCDC, ITrust and Think. David Akeroyd declared his interest as a Director of Think.
B23/054	Agenda Item No. 4: Minutes of the meeting held on 21 March 2023 It was RESOLVED to approve the minutes of the meeting held on 21 March 2023.
B23/055	Agenda I tem No. 5: Matters arising from the last meeting There were no matters arising.
B23/056	Agenda Item No. 6: Rolling Action List It was RESOLVED to note the Rolling Action List.
B23/057	Agenda I tem No. 7: Assurance Based Governance Governors noted the update to the Assurance Based Governance monitoring table and noted the assurance that it provided in relation to the instruments and articles of Government and performance against the Code of Good Governance.

B23/059	Agenda I tem No. 9: Principal's report The Chair noted that the Principal/CEO had tendered his resignation and would be leaving Barnsley to take up a new post as CEO at The Bedford College Group. Governors expressed their thanks and congratulations to the Principal for all of the work he had done and the impact he had made on the College, its staff, students and the wider community.



The Principal presented his report. Governors noted the update on the IoT project and the Union ballot regarding the pay award for 2022/23. Governors discussed union numbers, timetable for balloting and the potential impact of strikes. It was also noted that the AoC were not yet in a position to make a recommendation on pay for the coming year. It was noted that the College had received funding through the FE Capital Transformation Fund. The Principal updated governors that the College was now able to apply for loan facilities via the DfE. It was noted that the College would be passing the ITS legacy provision at Mansfield to Vision West Nott's College. Five members of Barnsley College staff would be TUPED over. It was also noted that the College had suspended the College's membership of the CBI. It was RESOLVED to note the **Principal's report** B23/060 Agenda Item No. 10: Management Accounts The Vice Principal Finance presented the management accounts and noted that the College was currently on track to exceed its key financial targets set in the budget and financial plan. Governors noted that College income is significantly greater than budget due to additional AEB and the Skills Development Fund. Governors discussed the apprenticeship target and noted that the College was not likely to meet it this year although it will meet its reforecast. Governors discussed a treasury management policy and the risks associated with concentrating cash in one bank given the uncertainties and instabilities in the financial markets currently and it was agreed that this would reviewed. Governors noted that agency staffing costs are forecast to increase. It was RESOLVED to note the update.

	The Vice Principal Finance presented an update in relation to the College's financial health which the ESFA have confirmed is Good.
	Governors noted that the ESFA rating is a key piece of assurance that the Board can rely on for the College's financial performance and management. It was also noted that the ESFA have noted the auditor comments in relation to the energy contract procurement.
	It was RESOLVED to note the ESFA Financial Health Letter and the assurance that it provides.
B23/063	Agenda Item No. 13: Balanced Scorecard Measures 2023/24
	The Deputy Principal Development and Productivity presented the performance measures for the Balanced Scorecard 2023/24
	Governors noted that the key performance indicators (KPIs) were reviewed at this stage before individual targets were finalised and presented to the Board for approval.
	Governors discussed the KPIs proposed and it was agreed that they reflected the discussions at the strategic seminar. It was also agreed that the Balanced Scorecard was a valuable tool for governors to monitor performance and gain assurance that the College was meeting its plans.
	It was RESOLVED to approve the proposed Balanced Scorecard measures.
B23/064	Agenda Item No.14: Quality Improvement Plan (QIP) Update
	The Vice Principal Quality presented the QIP update.
	Governors noted the apprenticeship achievement rate for 2021/22 was 63.6% compared to a national rate of 53.4%.
	Challenges remain at the sixth form and it was noted that a Governor link visit had taken place recently.



	Significant work was ongoing around English and Maths and it was noted that a deep dive into this area was ongoing which would report back to the board in July. Governors discussed the legacy impact of Covid on student's development and subsequent achievement and it was agreed that it would take many years still for its impact to work its way through the system for some students. It was RESOLVED to note the QIP update.
B23/065	Agenda Item No. 15: GCSE English and Maths Results – November resit The Vice Principal Quality presented GCSE English and Maths results. Governors noted that although the results were disappointing, some of the interventions were having a clear impact and students are better prepared for their Summer 2022 exam. Again it was noted that the results from the Deep Dive would be useful. It was RESOLVED to note the GCSE English and Maths update.
B23/066	Agenda Item No. 16: Analysis of Complaints The Vice Principal Quality presented a report on the formal complaints received during the 2022/23 academic year. It was noted that the college had changed the way they managed complaints recognising the value that informal complaints can have. It was agreed that there remained a challenge around communications in some areas but that this was being addressed and staff supported where appropriate. It was RESOLVED to note the analysis of complaints report and the assurance that it provides.
