Counselling Skills Level 3 Part-time

In Brief

Start Date / Duration

This course next starts in September 2024. Time and dates to be confirmed but classes are usually available during the day and evening.

Entry Requirements

- Candidates will need to be aged 19 or above.
- Possession of a Level 2 qualification in Counselling Skills/Helping Skills (proof of this will be expected at enrolment).
- GCSE Grade C or above in English Language (or the equivalent).

You will achieve

NCFE CACHE Level 3 Diploma in Counselling Skills

Course Overview

This qualification is ideal for those seeking to enhance their functional role through the use of counselling skills. Learners will gain an understanding of a range of counselling skills and have the opportunity to examine some of the various schools of thought/theoretical models associated with them. The course is suitable for professionals employed in education, welfare or social services wishing to develop a counselling role. It may also be appropriate for those working in a voluntary capacity with self-help groups or other agencies.

A commitment to equal opportunities is an essential component of this course.

This qualification does not qualify learners to practise as a counsellor.

Course Content

To be awarded the Level 3 Diploma in Counselling Skills, learners are required to successfully complete 5 mandatory units:

- Unit 01 Developing counselling skills
- Unit 02 Theoretical approaches in the use of counselling skills

- Unit 03 Working ethically with counselling skills
- Unit 04 Counselling skills and diversity
- Unit 05 Counselling skills and personal development

How will I be assessed?

- Continuous assessment through assignments/reflective journals and a portfolio of evidence.
- Candidates must submit a completed portfolio of evidence by the end of the course for final assessment. External verifier may request photocopying part of your portfolio but your confidentiality will be maintained at all times.
- Minimum 90% attendance, which will be monitored throughout the course.

- You already have a level 3 qualification or higher (achieved before April 2021) but earn below £21,255 annually
- You already have a level 3 qualification or higher (achieved before April 2021) but are unemployed and in receipt of a means-tested benefit.
