Professional Practice in Health and Social Care Foundation Degree FdSc

In Brief

Start Date / Duration

This course starts again in September 2020, the full-time course runs for two years and will be delivered over two days per week. It is also expected that students undertake a 200 hour work placement throughout the course in order to meet the learning outcomes of the programme. The placement is usually completed over two days per week from January to May (this is in addition to the classroom –based learning).

Entry Requirements

48 UCAS points from one of the following:

- Access to HE Diploma from a QAA recognised Access to HE course
- A Levels, AS Levels, CACHE qualifications, BTEC Diplomas and other Level 3 qualifications will be considered with related work experience

Plus

- Normally GCSE English Language or English Literature and mathematics at grade C or above or equivalents (please see below)

GCSE English and mathematics equivalents

- Level 2 Adult Numeracy /Literacy
- Level 2 Key Skills /Application of Number
- Equivalency test from www.equivalencytesting.co.

Personal qualities

- You must be able to demonstrate your potential to be caring and compassionate and the ability to develop meaningful relationships with service users and carers.

You will also need

- [Disclosure and Barring Service \(DBS\)](#) clearance to enable you to undertake placements in settings with children and vulnerable adults.
- Occupational health screening (to determine your suitability to undertake the course). DBS and occupational health screening will be requested at your expense.

Course Overview

This flexible foundation degree is a work based learning award which combines health and social care education with either existing employment or work placements to develop your skills and competencies for a wide range of roles across health, social or community care sectors.

The course, which is an award of Sheffield Hallam University, has two routes. For those already employed in assistant or support worker roles in health, social or community care the course allows you to complete both the Higher Apprenticeship in Health (Assistant Practitioner) and the Foundation Degree. The course provides you with your continuing personal and professional development and depending on your employer, would allow you to undertake a Band 4 Associate /Assistant role.

For those of you who are not in employment the course will provide you with a placement in a suitable health, social or community care role, which will allow you to develop the necessary skills and competencies alongside your academic studies to complete the Foundation Degree.

Course Content

Year 1:

- Work-based learning-academic (20 Credits)
- Work-based learning-practice (20 Credits)
- Reflective & personal development skills (20 Credits)
- Essential sciences for person centred care (40 Credits)
- Integrated holistic assessment and delivery of health and social care interventions (20 Credits)

Year 2:

- Work based learning-academic (20 Credits)
- Work-based learning-practice (20 Credits)
- Promoting health, wellbeing and independence (40 Credits)
- Using and evaluating evidence to inform practice (20 Credits)
- Leadership and management. (20 Credits)

The evidence for the work based learning modules in Year 1 and 2 will be sought from a suitable health, social or community role from either existing employment or a work placement.

Also available as a Level 5 Higher Apprenticeship – Assistant Practitioner (Health). To be eligible to apply you should be employed in a suitable health, social care or community setting and work enough hours each week so that you undertake sufficient, regular training and on-the-job activity (e.g. 30 + hours per week). The Higher Apprenticeship is funded by your employer and therefore your employer must also approve your application. The course will deliver against the nationally recognised Healthcare Assistant Practitioner Apprenticeship Standard <https://www.instituteforapprenticeships.org/apprenticeship-standards/healthcare-assistant-practitioner> [<https://www.instituteforapprenticeships.org/apprenticeship-standards/healthcare-assistant-practitioner>]. How will I be assessed?

You will be assessed by completing a variety of appropriate assessments. These include; Assessments of practice, reflective portfolios, written assignments, literature reviews, case studies, presentations and interviews.

A Maintenance Loan of up to £6,904 per year will be available to eligible students living with parents or up to £8,200 per year to those living away from home. EU Students cannot apply.

Students with children or dependant adults may qualify for a Childcare Grant or Adult Dependents' Grant. Students can apply for these at the same time as applying for a Maintenance Loan.

Remember: Eligible students will not have to pay tuition fees in advance and can apply for the Maintenance Loan before they start the course.
