Children, Young People and Families Practitioner Level 4 Apprenticeship

In Brief

Start Date / Duration

You can start an
Apprenticeship at any time.
Typically, 24 months for new
entrants. For those with
relevant qualifications and
experience in the health and
social care field, 12 to 18
months.

Entry Requirements

- You should be at least 18 years old. We do not set any other entry requirements.
- You will need to be working, volunteering or on practical placement in a residential childcare setting.
- You must undertake the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) process and provide the result.
- You will need to find an employer to employ you as an apprentice. Please see our <u>Apprenticeship</u> <u>vacancies</u>.

You will achieve

- Children, Young People and Families Practitioner Level 4 Apprenticeship Standard
- NCFE CACHE Level 3 Diploma for Residential Childcare (England) – License to practice
- Level 2 Functional Skills Maths and English

Course Overview

This apprenticeship will develop knowledge and skills needed when working with children and young people including an understanding of child development. As a practitioner, you will be working with children, young people and families, including carers, to achieve positive and sustainable change in lives.

Apprentices may be able to progress on to the following job roles:

- Residential childcare workers
- Registered residential managers
- Deputy and assistant managers in adult and children and young peoples settings.

Course Content

This qualification will develop the knowledge and skills needed when working with children and young people in a residential childcare setting, including an understanding of child and young person development. The qualification enables you to gain essential skills including: wellbeing and resilience, positive relationships and attachments, health and safety, sexual exploitation, communication, positive behaviour and positive outcomes. It also offers you the opportunity to cover optional topics which are particularly suited to specific residential childcare and respite care settings.

How will I be assessed?

You will be assessed through practical observations within the work place and coursework. Upon completion of the course you will be expected to undertake an End Point Assessment which includes:

- Observation of practice
- A competence interview informed by submission of a portfolio.

What Equipment Will I Need?

You will require access to a computer and the internet.

Where will I study?

You will study within the workplace and may also be expected to attend classes at Barnsley College.

What can I do next?

On successful completion of the course, you may be able to progress on to the Level 5 Diploma in Leadership and Management or a foundation degree in a related discipline. You can also progress to the following roles:

- Deputy manager
- Residential childcare workers
- Registered residential managers
- Deputy and assistant managers in adult and children and young peoples settings.

How much does the course cost?

There is no cost to being an apprentice. All costs associated with your apprenticeship, including the cost of training and your salary, will be paid by your employer.
