

# Childcare and Teacher Training

## Children, Young People and Families Practitioner Level 4 Apprenticeship

### In Brief

#### Start Date / Duration

You can start an Apprenticeship at any time. You will study for 24 months as a new entrant. For those with relevant qualifications and experience in the Health and Social Care field, you will study for 12 to 18 months.

#### Entry Requirements

- You should be at least 18 years old. We do not set any other entry requirements but colleges or training providers may have their own guidelines.
- Learners will need to be working, volunteering or on practical placement in a residential childcare setting, as they need to show competence in both knowledge and skills.
- Undertake the Disclosure and Barring Service process and provide the result.
- You will need to find an employer to employ you as an apprentice. Please see our [Apprenticeship vacancies](#).

#### You will achieve

- Children, Young People and Families Practitioner, Level 4 Apprenticeship Standard
- Diploma for Residential Childcare (England) – License to practice NCFE CACHE Level 3
- Functional Skills Maths and English Level 2

### Course Overview

This Qualification will develop the knowledge and skills needed when working with children and young people including an understanding of Child Development Level 3 Diploma Residential Childcare (England) Serves as the required qualification under the Children’s Homes (England) Regulations 2015.

As a practitioner, you will be working with children, young people and families, including carers, to achieve positive and sustainable change in lives.

Learners may be able to progress on to the following job roles:

- Residential childcare workers

- Registered residential managers, deputy and assistant managers in adult and children and young peoples settings.

## Course Content

This qualification will develop the knowledge and skills needed when working with children and young people in a residential childcare setting, including an understanding of child and young person development.

The qualification enables the learner to gain essential skills and knowledge to support children and young people in residential childcare settings, including: wellbeing and resilience, positive relationships and attachments, health and safety, sexual exploitation, communication, positive behaviour and positive outcomes. It also offers the learner the opportunity to cover optional topics which are particularly suited to specific residential childcare and respite care settings.

## How will I be assessed?

You will be assessed through practical observations within the work place and coursework. Upon completion of course work you will be expected to undertake an end point assessment which includes:

1. Observation of practice.
2. A competence interview informed by submission of a portfolio.

## What Equipment Will I Need?

You will require access to a computer and internet.

## Where will I study?

You will study within the workplace and may be expected to attend classes at Barnsley College.

## What can I do next?

Once completed learners may be able to progress on to the Level 5 Diploma in Leadership and Management or a Foundation Degree in a related discipline.

Learners can also progress to the following roles:

- Residential services manager
- Deputy manager

## How much does the course cost?

There is no cost to being an apprentice. All costs associated with your apprenticeship, including

the cost of training and your salary, will be paid by your employer.
