In Brief

Start Date / Duration

The course will start on September 2025 and will run for 18 months. (term time only) Classes are expected to run on a Tuesday and Wednesday evenings from 5.30pm until 8.30pm.

Entry Requirements

- Aged 19+
- Grade 4 (C) or above in both Maths and English
- Level 2 Qualification in Electrotechnical craft (2365) or Technical Certificate in Electrical Installation(8202-20)

You will achieve

Advanced Technical Diploma in Electrical Installation (450), City and Guilds, Level 3

Course Overview

The Level 3 Advanced Technical Diploma in Electrical Installation (450) are for learners who are interested in developing the specific technical and professional skill that will lead to meaningful employment in the electrotechnical industry. Learners will explore a wide range of industry areas including principles of electrical science, inspection and testing, and electrical system diagnosis, all to the current edition of the wiring regulations.

This technical qualification focuses on the development of knowledge and practical skills needed for working in the electrotechnical industry, which will prepare you to enter an electrotechnical apprenticeship programme. On completion of the Apprenticeship, the learner will be recognised by the industry as competent as an installation or maintenance electrician

Course Content

The qualification will help you gain an understanding of the skills required within the electrotechnical sector. You will cover compulsory aspects such as:

- Working safely and effectively
- Design, construct, test and commission electrical systems
- Methods of supervision
- Electrical science and principles
- Regulations and law
- Diagnose and repair electrical faults.

How will I be assessed?

The exam is externally set and externally marked, and will be paper-based only.

The exam is designed to assess the candidate's depth and breadth of understanding across content in the qualification at the end of the period of learning, using a range of question types and will be sat under invigilated examination conditions.

The synoptic assignment is externally set, internally marked and externally moderated. The assignment requires candidates to identify and use effectively in an integrated way an appropriate

selection of skills, techniques, concepts, theories, and knowledge from across the content area. Candidates will be judged against the assessment objectives.

What can I do next?

This technical qualification focuses on the development of knowledge and practical skills needed for working in the electrotechnical industry, which will prepare you to enter an electrotechnical apprenticeship programme. On completion of the Apprenticeship, the learner will be recognised by the industry as competent as an installation or maintenance electrician. Once qualified, there are many further specific and specialised qualifications enhancing skills within the industry, such as electrical design, inspection and testing, appliance safety and environmental technology systems. Universities accept this qualification, if wanting to pursue electrical engineering academically including HNC's and HND's.
