Childcare: An Introduction to Caring for Children Level 1 Full-time

In Brief

Start Date / Duration

This course starts in September 2020 and runs for one year.

Entry Requirements

Three GCSEs at grade 2/E or above including English

Or

A full qualification in a relevant subject at Entry Level and Level 1 functional skills in English and maths.

- You will also need to successfully pass a Disclosure Barring Service – (DBS).
- You will require a positive reference from school and to be able to provide evidence of previous work experience in a related area.
- You will normally take part in an interview prior to being enrolled on the programme.

You will achieve

CACHE Level 1 Certificate Introduction to Children and Young People's Settings and Health and Social Care.

Course Overview

These qualifications encourage an understanding of the knowledge and the skills needed to care for young children. They cover children's growth, learning and development. These qualifications are suitable for you if you are considering a career in caring for children.

Course Content

To achieve the qualification you will need to undertake:

- Meetings or study with the course advisor, tutor or assessor
- Personal study such as private reading and completing assessments
- Time being assessed to undertake practical work or work experience

- Human Growth and Development
- Healthy Living
- Preparing for your Next Steps
- Self-Development
- Investigating a Vocational Area
- Craft Activities for Young Children
- Healthy Eating for Families
- Growth and Development of Young children

- Science Activities for Young Children
- Safeguarding the Welfare of Children and Young People
- Technology Activities for Young Children
- Functional skills in English, Mathematics and Information and Communication Technology (ICT) help people to gain the most out of life, learning and work

How will I be assessed?

To achieve the unit you must provide evidence to meet all of the assessment criteria. CACHE Learner Achievement Log records your progress in achieving the assessment criteria and completing the units.

- CACHE core text book
- A willingness to travel to your placements (this may on occasion involve two bus journeys)
- Stationery
- A college polo shirt for work placement
