Course Overview

The Pearson BTEC Level 3 Subsidiary Diploma in Construction and the Built Environment (QCF) (360 GLH) is primarily a Technical Level qualification, equivalent in size to an A level, which has been designed to occupy one third of the curriculum within a broader programme of study, which could include other vocational or academic qualifications. Its main purpose is to allow learners to develop the core specialist knowledge, understanding and skills, including mathematical techniques to solve construction problems, required by the sector. It provides a basis for progression into a broad range of roles within the sector when supported by relevant qualifications at level 2, such as GCSE English and mathematics, and/or at level 3, such as Business ,IT, Engineering and mathematics. Learners have some opportunity to study in more depth a range of option areas of their choice, including Surveying in Construction and Civil Engineering.

You will study at our purpose built Construction Centre on the Honeywell Campus. The Centre opened in 2015 and accommodates students studying a range of construction trades, including brickwork, plumbing, plastering, joinery, painting and decorating.

The Centre, also known as The CUBE, houses innovative and inspiring work areas with industry-led equipment, providing a high quality learning experience for students. Facilities include:

- Workshops
- CAD suite with Architectural software (CAD and BIM)
- A project workshop for new construction technologies
- Break-out areas allowing students to work independently.

Course Content

All students will study the following **six** mandatory units;

- Health safety and welfare in CBE
- Sustainable construction
- Construction technology and design in construction and civil engineering
- Science and materials in CBE
- Mathematics in CBE
- Building technology in construction

How will I be assessed?

All the units are assessed through assignment work. This will include written reports, presentations, group work, and other methods.

What Equipment Will I Need?

You will need basic stationary and a scientific calculator.

What can I do next?
