Dog Grooming Level 2 Part-time - Wednesday Daytime

In Brief

Start Date / Duration

This course will run on Wednesdays between 10.00am and 3.30pm from 11 September 2024 to 13 January 2025 (Term-time only). This course will be offered again in January 2025.

Entry Requirements

- Basic literacy and IT skills will be required to complete this qualification
- Learners will be aged 19+ to study this part time course
- Completion of the four week introductory course

You will achieve

Level 2 Certificate for Dog Grooming Assistants

Course Overview

Based at our Wigfield Farm campus, this qualification is ideal if you wish to enter the dog grooming industry for personal or professional reasons. You will learn dog grooming techniques that include preparation, bathing, drying and basic grooming techniques, and on completion you will be able to work under supervision in a dog grooming salon.

There are three classes you can apply for:

Course Content

You will study the following areas:

- Prepare and groom dogs prior to bathing
- Bathe and clean dogs
- Clean and maintain equipment used for grooming or removing hair from animals
- Control and restrain animals

- Dry dogs and prepare their coats for styling
- Basic trimming of a dog's coat
- Move animals between locations
- Maintain the cleanliness and bio security of the animal care working environment

You will complete a portfolio of practical and written evidence that shows achievement of all relevant learning outcomes.

Level 3 Diploma in Dog Grooming

Level 2 or 3 Technical Certificate/Diploma in Animal Care.

How much does the course cost?

This course costs £546. There may be funding available for this course – please see the drop-down option below for more details. You must also be living in the South Yorkshire or West Yorkshire

region. There is also an introductory course which must be completed which costs £85. There is no funding available for the introductory course, so all learners must pay this fee.

Eligibility for Funding

Part-time courses are only available for learners who are 19 years old and above. You may not have to pay for this course if you are employed but earn below £23,400 a year, or if you are unemployed and receive Job Seekers Allowance, Employment and Support Allowance or Universal Credit. You will need to provide evidence of your eligibility which will be checked at enrolment.

This course is funded by South Yorkshire Mayoral Combined Authority (SYMCA) and/or West Yorkshire Combined Authority (WYCA). You must be living in the South or West Yorkshire regions to qualify for funding.
