

Barnsley Sixth Form College the A Level Student

Expectations

Attendance to College is an essential part of being an A Level student. Attendance to the whole program of study is a requirement to be successful at Sixth Form.

Punctuality is required to be of the highest standard at A Levels. Arriving to lessons before the start time to ensure you are prepared and ready to begin the lesson on time is a must.

Preparing for each lesson is of great importance, arriving to the lesson with all the required resources and all the pre-work completed is an expectation at Sixth Form.

Absences – in the event of an absence, it must be reported to the absences line ([Reporting Absence | Barnsley Sixth Form College](#)). Any work that has been missed from the absence occurrence must be completed independently and caught up before entering the next lesson. All resources to support this can be found on teams.

Equipment:

- Large ring binder folder. You **need** one of these per subject you are studying.
- Day folder. You **need** one of these per subject you are studying. You can use your day folder on a day-to-day basis; however, you must bring in your ring binder at least once each half term, this will be directed by your subject tutor.
- You must arrive to College with the equipment required to undergo your lesson:
 - Black pens.
 - Coloured pens/highlighters.
 - Ruler.
 - Pencil.
 - Lined paper.

Additional subject specific equipment will be informed by your subject tutor.

Study:

In the Sixth Form you are required to complete five hours of independent study each week per each A Level:

1st Term – The content and tasks you need to do will be 100% directed by your subject tutor.

2nd Term – The content and tasks you will need to do with 50/50 decided by yourself and by your subject tutor.

3rd Term – The content and tasks you will need to do will be 100% decided by yourself.

The five hours of work will need to be evidenced to subject tutors. This work will need to be dated and align with your folder front sheet.
